Students are required to live on-campus for two years.



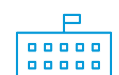

- ✓ A minimum score of 115 on the Duolingo English Test

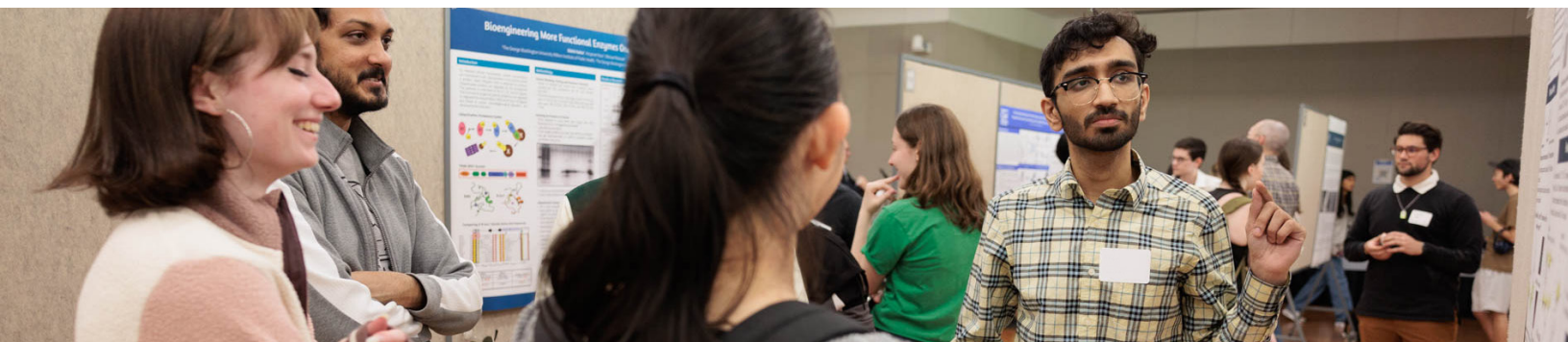
